The Altrusa Scholarship is designed to honor outstanding seniors from Douglas, Roseburg (HS & ASTRA), Glide, Sutherlin or Oakland High Schools providing minimum requirements are met. These students will be honored at an Altrusa meeting in the spring and a total up to **\$3,500** will be awarded on May 28, 2020.

PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY:

Answer each question as fully as possible. High school students should return this completed form to their high school counselor who is in charge of scholarships **no later than April 3, 2020.**

Top applicants will be selected for an interview with the Altrusa scholarship committee. The interviews will be held **only on Saturday, May 9, 2020.**

Return your application to include:

1. Application (no substitutions).
2. Your official transcript and a copy of your SAT or ACT showing your classes, grades, and class rank (available in your high school counseling center).
3. Responses to two questions under personal statement section.
4. Two letters of recommendation (one of which is to be from someone outside your school environment).

Do Not include a High School Portfolio or Resume.

The application will be disqualified, if:

1. Your signature does not appear on the last page of the application.
2. Your application is not complete and on official form.
3. **ABSOLUTELY NO—"SEE ATTACHMENT"!** However, there are several areas that require you to attach a separate page as needed.
4. A high school portfolio or resume' is included.
5. Any information is intentionally falsified.
6. Your application will be disqualified if you do not include your official transcript and a copy of your SAT or ACT.

The following criteria will be considered when making selections:

1. Application is complete, neat, and organized.
2. GPA (minimum accumulative GPA of 3.0), SAT, or ACT and applicant's goals.
3. Financial need.
4. Work experience.
5. School involvement.
6. Community involvement.
7. Personal statements.
8. Interview.
